Wolff "Good evening Johnny...Come in won't you...And have a chair."

John "Thank you."

Wolff "Now...How can I help you?"

John "I um..I...Oh Reverend Wolff you have to help me!"

Wolff "Whatever's the matter?"

John (Blurts out.) " I'm at my wits end...I've been embezzling money at work and I'm going to be found out and I've been thinking of all sorts of horrible ways to end it!"

Wolff "Oh no Child...Tell me all about it?"

John "Well...I started just...You know...Taking a bit here and there for lunch...And then I thought I might be short over the weekend...And then I took more and more...And I'm just glad they don't hang people any longer..."

Wolff (Shaking his head.)
